March's *Six* concert was given by "Company" – a group of musical theatre students from the RSAMD in Glasgow. They presented a varied programme of West End hits and other well-known songs, all of which were delivered with style and panache.

The Circle of Life from Disney's *The Lion King* was a bold and effective opening. The singers' voices blended wonderfully and they quickly captivated the audience.

The show continued with an Elton John selection and a *Phantom of the Opera* medley. These allowed the individual members of the group to display their vocal skills, and were all engaging renditions.

Two songs from the (not particularly successful) 2000 show, *The Wild Party*, were in fact two of the most exciting performances of the evening. Craig Deuchar's *What is it about her?* And Nicole Rowley's *Life of the party*, were both really characterful interpretations of difficult songs.

A slick medley of songs from *Les Miserables* led up to the closing numbers – group versions of *Do you hear the people sing?* and *A New World* which provided a rousing end to this thoroughly enjoyable show.
